- Approval of June 14, 2017 Minutes Minutes from the June 14, 2017 meeting were reviewed and approved as written.
- CoC 2017 Proposed Ranking Order Vote: The Executive Committee motioned that the following revised ranking order be
  approved by the General Membership. The motion passed unanimously with 16 votes.
  - A. Projects within first year of operation determined to be Eligible Without Conditions.
  - B. Renewal projects determined to be Eligible Without Conditions, ranked from highest to lowest score.
  - C. Renewal projects and projects within the first year of operation determined to be Eligible With Conditions, ranked from highest to lowest score.
